HFHC Training Programs Expanding!

Thanks to Rebuilding Hope 2020 funding and the assistance of partner organizations in Haiti, we have been blessed to expand the training programs for our orphaned children. Haitian young adults face a myriad of challenges including lack of prospective employment, lack of access to continued education, and few productive activities. Many are at high risk for dangers such as gang membership, child trafficking, and teen pregnancy.

To combat these risks, HFHC has partnered with Hunger Relief International (HRI) on a microenterprise program for orphaned youths between 15 - 18 years old to have the opportunity to become part of a working business. Trained HRI facilitators and working professionals manage the program. Among the many learning opportunities, the participants experience firsthand what it means to create and build a business, interact with customers, manage finances, reinvest earnings, and save profits. The youth engage in projects which benefit their community while preparing them for a future where they can take care of themselves and earn a living.

Cazeau orphaned youth are not just learning valuable skills such as tailoring, sewing, and computer technology, but the older teens are being trained as entrepreneurs. It is exciting to see that HRI assists with microloans for the youth to work together to establish real businesses. This year our teens began a used clothing kiosk as well as a cell phone recharging business. They have established bank accounts and have learned to "re-invest" in their enterprises.

What a blessing to see our youth learn to lead businesses which can later employ others!

In January 2012, I had the privilege of being on the HFHC mission team that saw the opening of the Thomazeau orphanage and was able to meet the children the very first week of their arrival. Seeing the six little boys and six little girls all around two- to three-years -old, most of them orphaned as the direct result of the 2010 earthquake, was such a joy. Knowing that these children had been rescued from a life of unimaginable poverty and deprivation was very gratifying.

At that time, the two dormitories for the children were adequate but very small. There were four bunk beds in each dorm — two beds end-to-end on each side of the room with a narrow walkway in between. I remember thinking, "It is a good thing the kids are little."

It has been six years since that day, and those children are not so little anymore. In January 2018, I was again blessed to join the mission team when those same children moved into their newlycompleted dormitories. The brightlypainted rooms were very spacious and should provide ample area to see them all the way through their teenage years. Then I saw the bathroom and shower facilities. Wow!! They would satisfy even the most discriminating of tastes. While in the United States most of us would consider these "standard living conditions," these sweet Haitian children consider them to be absolutely luxurious!

This new dormitory is the next step in the long-range expansion plan to enable even more orphans to be cared for. Orphan care continues to be a critical need in Haiti. The call of our Savior is clear: "Whatever you have done for one of the least of these, you have done it unto me." Would you please open your heart and purse strings and consider this very worthy work in your donation plans?

HFHC Sponsored Child Wins the 2017 Miss Creole Pageant!

Kendaly Phele, a former HFHC-sponsored child, was awarded Miss Creole 2017 this past October in Port-au-Prince.

Contestants were judged on their poise, communication effectiveness, and economic proposals which could lead to future womenled businesses. Kendaly's winning project featured the manufacturing of hand-made women's jewelry, handbags, and sandals.

After the 2010 earthquake, Kendaly's mother, a seamstress, had difficulty finding steady work. She was unable to send Kendaly and her siblings to school without the assistance of HFHC's Child Education Sponsorship Program. Thanks to her HFHC sponsor, Kendaly graduated from Delmas Christian School in June 2014. She then applied to the University of Port-au-Prince, where Kendaly was awarded a scholarship to study Social Economics. She plans to complete her baccalaureate degree later this year, locate a microloan, and start her small business!


2,658 Christmas Joy Boxes Delivered!


