Crisis Update by Ken Bever, President

Violent gangs in Port-au-Prince have expanded their reign of fear in Port-au-Prince over these past three months. Our children and staff are caught in a "civil war" between violent gang leaders who have banded together to control 80% of Port-au-Prince and are attempting to control the ports, fuel supplies, and illegal drug trade which was formerly controlled by wealthy oligarch families living high above Port-au-Prince in the mountains of Petionville. On April 8, Haiti's political leaders finalized a nine-member ruling council and an agreement to serve as the framework of a 22-month transitional government that will be charged with returning order to the country. This agreement needs to be confirmed by the current prime minister Ariel Henry. At that point, several countries have offered to assist Haiti with military force to aid police in removing the gangs from their stranglehold on the city.

With 100% of operations run by trusted Haitian Christians outside of gang-controlled areas, we are not running away from this crisis. Instead, we are committed even more to help our sponsored children and families survive this turmoil. Our priorities have been to secure food for the children we serve and assist our sponsored children's families who were displaced from their homes by the gangs in Port-au-Prince. We continue to keep 3 months of food in reserve for our 63 orphaned children in Port-au-Prince. In addition, we praise God that thanks to many compassionate donors, our Haiti team has been able to pack 400 crisis relief kits filled with food staples and personal care items and distribute them all to displaced families. The notes of thanks from our sponsored children's parents have been so encouraging. We are now looking at a second round of assistance in May to these families as the crisis continues and can certainly utilize additional crisis relief gifts for this effort.

I am thankful to report that **nine of our ten schools continue to operate** most school days and are serving a hot meal to all the children at their schools. We are making alternative arrangements for the students of our one school unable to physically operate since it is still in a gang-controlled area. We pray that this crisis will abate by next Fall and that the school building will be accessible. If it is not, alternative locations for normal school operations are under consideration.

We continue to monitor the situation closely and will keep you updated on the status. Please continue to pray for our courageous Haiti staff who are putting forth a herculean effort, and pray for a quick end to all the violence and intense suffering.

It's heartbreaking to read story after story reporting more bad news. However, despite the challenges, we believe God is present in Haiti, shining His light in the darkness. Therefore, it is not all bad news; the good news of Jesus continues to bring hope, life, and peace to Haiti.

Here are specific things to pray for...

- Pray for God to protect the children of Haiti and HFHC's Haiti staff.
- Pray for God to restore peace to Haiti and for the gangs to stop the violence.
- Pray for God to provide every Haitian with their daily bread.
- Pray for the international community's response to Haiti.
- Pray for God to protect the Christians in Haiti and to use them to show the way of Jesus even amidst the challenges.





Textbooks for Classrooms

The Need: Many parents cannot afford the textbooks essential for their children's education. To address this, we aim to purchase 20 copies of each required textbook to be stationed at the school, ensuring accessibility for all students during their school hours.

Child Sponsorship: A Humbling Experience by Julie Georges

Having been involved with Hope for Haiti's Children since 1995, I have sponsored a few children over the years. There is nothing like meeting the child you sponsor. To connect a face to the child that you are providing an education, access to health care, some food—and now an actual daily meal during the school year —is rewarding. But nothing beats seeing in their eyes how blessed they feel to meet you. Very often, they tell you that they pray for you every day! That is most humbling. Their prayers are offered hoping that your circumstances will allow your continued support—which is a blessing—I hope the same thing.

They find hope in knowing that someone out there cares enough about them to provide the support that will shape their future. They feel an increased sense of personal

ownership and agency in making full use of their sponsor's investment. I've sponsored children with varying aptitudes, some were great in school, others not so much—but I could always see how hard they worked to make their lives better. So, does sponsorship work? I would answer Yes!

One child I sponsored in the early days was named Fritz. I started sponsoring him when he was 5 or 6 years old. I sort of picked him out. He was prone to ill health as a child but always did well in school. We developed a close relationship because I visited Haiti often. He graduated secondary school in the top of his class. I continued to sponsor him through the PACES program (Promising Adult Continued

Education Sponsorship). This gave him access to the University—and oddly enough he didn't perform well there. After several semesters of dropping out of classes and getting low grades, I finally had to stop sponsoring him. What he did do well was to apply himself to his spiritual development. He kept in contact with me and called me his mom. He grew up in an orphanage and really had no immediate family nearby to help him. I sent money to him occasionally, and he let me know about some opportunities that came his way, none of which seemed very viable. So I was super surprised when I was reading a Haiti Operations update and saw that Fritz was in Thomazeau serving as an Outreach Minister and the School Spiritual Life Co-Director. He not only was co-leading church evangelistic seminars, but was also training local leaders in Saturday leadership seminars and helping with Camp Hope 2023, providing mentoring and Christian leadershiptraining to 200 HFHC teens. I wasn't sure how Fritz would fare in his life in Haiti as an adult, but he surprised me and I couldn't be prouder.
