# Healthy Steps Forward: Celebrating Our Nurses' Impact on Preventative Care by Ken Bever, President

Health education is crucial for disease prevention. With the introduction of a school nurse in each of our ten schools, all students receive monthly lessons on important health topics, with an emphasis on preventative care. In December 2024, the focus was on the significance of good nutrition, where children learned about healthy fruits and vegetables. Other health topics have included gastrointestinal health, safe food preparation, the importance of latrines and sanitary environments, oral and dental care, personal hygiene, and age appropriate lessons on puberty, sexuality, and marriage.

Our nurses are also at the forefront of our healthcare ministry, providing year-round check-ups and follow-up care for any sponsored child with illnesses, injuries, or other medical concerns. Last year, 1,851 health cases involving sponsored children were successfully treated and resolved. This included 114 urgent or high priority cases, several of which involved life-threatening illnesses requiring immediate medical care.

The cost to have a nurse present daily in our schools is modest — only \$250 per month per nurse —but the impact on the children's health is substantial. Thanks to a matching grant, the cost in 2025 has been reduced to just \$125 per month per school nurse. Please consider sponsoring a nurse to continue this crucial ministry that is making a significant improvement in our children's health.







# Turning Rain into Life-giving Hope!

Water is life, and providing clean water for our children is essential to their health and well-being. Right now, three of our ten Christian schools have no access to city water or wells. Their only hope for safe water lies in capturing the rain that God so faithfully provides.

A Rainwater Catchment System is a simple yet powerful solution. Rain falls onto a metal roof and flows into PVC pipes, where it is filtered and directed into a large cistern. This stored water becomes a vital source for drinking, cooking, and hygiene, sustaining children and teachers throughout the year.

For two of these schools, high in Haiti's remote mountains, digging a well is impossible. The elevation is too great, and city water will never reach them. Their only reliable source of water is the rain God sends—if they have the means to collect it.

The third school, the Cite Soleil Christian School, faces a different struggle. Gangs have cut off access to city water, even destroying pipelines leading to the school. To ensure a safe and independent water source, they need a new slanted metal roof, proper piping, and a cistern to store the water.

# A Worthy Investment: Providing Bibles for Students by Meredith Hutchens

Many of you continue to wonder: Is there anything more I can do to help the children in Haiti? Does anything really make a difference? Those are worthy questions... ones we continually ask too. Let me assure you that the answer to both is a resounding YES! We still need your help!

Thanks to our newly formed Spiritual Director Cohort for the 2024-25 school year (and beyond!), each school now employs its own Spiritual Director who teaches a weekly Bible class to students in every grade level. Students also participate in prayer partners, service activities, and memory verse recitation. But without fail, Spiritual Directors complete every feedback form with a repeated request: **Bibles for their students.**

To accommodate their requests and put Bibles in students' hands for weekly Bible classes, we want to buy a set of Bibles for each school and designate them for use by our staff and students. In addition, we want to provide 200+ Camp Hope campers with their own personal Bible this summer when they come to camp. That comes to about 550 Bibles at \$10 per copy, for a total of \$5500. We hope to purchase the Bibles in Haiti in order to stimulate the local economy and instill a sense of high value on this endeavor.


The joy of holding a textbook of their very own, a fresh notebook, a sharp new pencil, or a calculator that will help them learn complex topics.
