

Average Allocation of Expenses 2002-2024




Cumulative Impact

Because of our generous supporters, over forty million dollars has been directed to Haitian children's programs and services since 2002.




Mission Focused

Hope for Haiti's Children is committed to maximizing every dollar to directly benefit children in Haiti. While the average nonprofit spends only 67 cents of every dollar on actual program services, HFHC has consistently exceeded that standard. From 2005 to 2022, an average of 88 cents of every dollar went directly to program services—well above industry standards. That means more resources going where they matter most: to transform the lives of children in Haiti.

Feeding Hope, Fueling Education

School meals have grown from 310 in 2014 to over 4,500 in 2025—fighting hunger and fueling learning. These meals are often a child's only reliable source of nutrition.



A Box Full of Joy

Each Joy Box brings a message of love and hope. In 2023, a record 3,877 boxes were delivered—filled with toys, school supplies, and care. This growing effort continues to bless thousands of children each Christmas.

Consistent Care, Lasting Love

Since 1997, HFHC has provided Christ-centered care for a total of 164 orphaned children— offering shelter, education, and spiritual support.
This ongoing care fosters healing, stability, and faithful leadership.



Spiritual Seeds Taking Root

Over 30 years, spiritual seeds have taken root—resulting in 641 baptisms through Camp Hope, Bible classes, and daily Christian teaching. Each one represents a life transformed and a step toward a Christ-centered future for Haiti.

30 YEARS OF HOPE: Transforming Lives in Haiti (1995–2025)



In May, Ken and Rhonda Bever with three members from the CT Valley Church of Christ travel to Port-au-Prince in response to an urgent appeal from Minister Jeantyrard Elmera to "come and see" what God is doing. In July, HFHC begins with 13 sponsored children.

1995

In partnership with local Christian leaders, HFHC begins caring for 23 rescued orphans in the Cazeau area of Port-au-Prince.

1997



The first annual Child Care Clinic provides medical and vision care to sponsored children.

2001



The first Christian Leadership Youth Camp is held at the Global Outreach facility, and ground is broken in Thomazeau for the future Hope Center.

2005



After a devastating 7.0-magnitude earthquake claims the lives of 36 nursing students and a doctor at the Delmas Christian School, HFHC presses on—rebuilding the school to double its original size and expanding the Thomazeau Hope Center to continue offering hope amid the heartbreak.

HFHC gains official Non-Government Organization (NGO) status in Haiti.

HFHC's sponsorship program expands to 100 children in 8 Christian schools.

HFHC's first permanent office in Haiti is established. Delmas Christian School opens, housed in the Delmas Eglise du Christ facility on the main thoroughfare in Port-au-Prince.

2004



A dormitory for 32 children is completed at the Cazeau Christian Orphanage. Also, the Delmas Christian School and church property is doubled.

2011



HFHC partners with the U.S. Denton Program, enabling vital aid shipments through the U.S. Air Force.

2006



God faithfully provides new house parents for the orphanage. Jean and Sonia Toussaint, mature in their faith and strong in spirit, bring stability, love, and spiritual leadership to the children in their care—blessing the program with their deep trust in God.



As part of Rebuilding Hope 2020, the Thomazeau Hope Center adds a 4,000 sq. ft. pavilion built by U.S. and Haitian volunteers. It serves as a hub for worship, education, and outreach.

42 baptisms—marking a
powerful milestone in the
students' spiritual journeys. It
is also the first year under full
Haitian leadership, reflecting
HFHC's goal of equipping and
empowering local leaders.

HFHC expands educational opportunities with two new preschools and computer labs in five schools. The food program provides 695,000 nutritious meals, while healthcare efforts reach more than 900 children with vital care.

HFHC transitions to year-round healthcare by placing a nurse in each school. These nurses provide ongoing care and monitoring of sponsored children's medical, dental, and vision needs. Also, a new Bible curriculum in Haitian Creole is introduced.

Hurricane Matthew brings widespread devastation to Haiti, creating the worst humanitarian crisis since the 2010 earthquake. HFHC responds swiftly—distributing food, clean water, medical aid, and shelter supplies through its trusted network of schools and churches. HFHC also supports the rebuilding of Christian schools in the hardest-hit communities.

2019

HFHC launches Project Hope 2030, a 10year plan to strengthen and expand its core programs. With over 2,000 children sponsored, the ministry deepens its efforts in education, healthcare, and leadership development. 2022

HFHC completes a new Hinche Christian school facility to serve students from kindergarten through high school. The School Lunch program expands to reach more children in our program. Students also gain better access to clean water, and new classrooms are added.

2024



Mirebalais Christian School nears completion, with new classrooms designed to accommodate grades K-13. The food program expands to include summer meals, along with the installation of a new water purification system at the Cazeau school. This year marks HFHC's most significant progress in its 30-year history.

Since entering the Cazeau Christian Orphanage at age 9, Louslande Dorcely has overcome many challenges and worked hard to achieve her dreams. She excelled academically and graduated high school at the top of her class. In 2017, she completed nursing school and now serves as the HFHC school nurse at the Cazeau Christian Orphanage. A dedicated mother of three, Louslande continues to give back with compassion and strength.



Jacob Luisius came to the Cazeau Christian Orphanage after being orphaned at just 3 years old. A bright and dedicated student, Jacob excelled academically and spiritually. After graduating high school, he pursued ministry training and earned his degree from the fouryear Delmas Theological Seminary in December 2021. Today, Jacob serves as the Spiritual Director at the Cazeau Christian School and as the Youth Outreach Minister at the Cazeau Church of Christ—faithfully pouring into the lives of children growing up where his own journey began.



Jean Rony Pierre joined HFHC's Child Sponsorship Program at age 6 and attended Camp Hope for 10 years, where he was baptized by his father and received the Outstanding Leadership Award. After high school, he began studying Education Science—but just months later, he tragically lost his father, the principal of Hinche Christian School. Jean Rony stepped into the role of principal while completing preacher training and now works toward his Master's in Education. A gifted leader and mentor, he married in 2022 and continues to serve with unwavering faith and purpose.



Junior Pierre-Antoine grew up at the Cazeau Christian Orphanage, where a sewing class sparked a lifelong passion. His talent led him to Haiti's prestigious Haute Couture design school, and after graduating, he returned to teach at the orphanage. Today, he runs Junior Fashion Shop and designs uniforms for HFHC schools—a powerful reminder of how faith and opportunity can transform a life and inspire others.

These are just a few stories of lives changed through Hope for Haiti's Children.
