


Our mission is focused on nurturing, educating, and training a new generation of outstanding Christian leaders in Haiti.

Thanks to our compassionate donors and in-country partners, we were blessed this past year with significant growth which enabled us to serve an even greater number of at-risk children in Haiti.

Education Sponsorship Ministry

Through the Hope for Haiti's Children (HFHC) education sponsorship program, children have the opportunity to receive a quality Christian education giving them hope and the chance to break the cycle of poverty. In 2013, HFHC:

- Added 171 new children to the child education sponsorship program (15% growth)
- Conducted the Christian Leadership Youth Camp focusing on spiritual uplift for our teens
- Began a Bible Verse Memorization Program for the Kindergarten through 6th grades
- Saw leaders emerging from graduates of the sponsorship program with some now becoming carpenters, police officers and teachers. Through the Promising Adult Education Sponsorship Program (PACES), students are given the opportunity to further their skills by taking post-secondary classes

Orphan Care Ministry

Hope for Haiti's Children supports 84 Haitian children at two orphanages, 72 at the Cazeau Christian Orphanage in Port-au-Prince and 12 at the Thomazeau Christian Orphanage at the HFHC Hope Center. The basic needs of children (food, water, clothing, electricity) were met as well as the following property improvements and sustainability projects:

- Repaired cracks in the stairwell and security wall, replaced unreliable gas stove, improved running water system for bathrooms and kitchen, enhanced power system to make cost-effective use of inverter/batteries charged from city power (Cazeau)
- Improved dormitory and bedrooms to meet new government standards--additional windows, clothes closets, desks (Cazeau)
- Improved the chicken coop to increase the number of egg-producing chickens (Cazeau)
- Constructed security gate at entrance to acreage and poured a concrete playground area outside of dormitory (Thomazeau)
- Improved the chicken and turkey coop and added more goats (Thomazeau)
- Expanded the garden area to improve onsite food production (Cazeau & Thomazeau)
- Added after-school English Clubs (Cazeau & Thomazeau)



School Development Ministry

Hope for Haiti's Children has established and funded 10 Christian school facilities in partnership with local Haitian Churches of Christ and their leaders. Necessary improvements and repairs in 2013 were varied:

- Constructed 1st Grade classroom with covered porch (Thomazeau)
- Fed children through a school lunch program (Cite Soleil, Cazeau and Thomazeau)
- Constructed school Benches (all ten schools)
- Acquired two school buses for transportation of students & teams
- Constructed third floor classrooms & school lunch cooking area (Delmas)
- Painted the interior walls and installed a playground (Ctie Soleil)
- Connected into the city water bringing water directly into the school (Hinche and Cite Soleil)
- Added an additional classroom & roof (Robert)

Volunteer Service Ministries

Hope for Haiti's Children was assisted in 2013 by caring volunteers who gave their time and talents. Below are just a few of the ways these supporters served the Haitian children:

Joy Box Program – Members from 26 congregations organized projects to pack and send 1,742 joy boxes to the children for Christmas.

Mission Trips – Three HFHC-sponsored teams assisted in efforts that directly benefit the children in our Sponsorship program:

- Medical Mission Trip team members provided an annual medical exam & assisted in updating child information
- Christian Youth Leadership Camp volunteers taught class and facilitated discussion groups to spiritually enrich teens. In addition, they directed recreational activities
- Joy Box Mission Trip delivered the gift boxes directly into the hands of our sponsored children

The HFHC Hope Center Mission House provided the facility for over 100 volunteers throughout the U.S. to serve from March through September. These volunteer-led teams assisted in projects where help was most needed at our Hope Center.

Non-Cash Donations - This year, through generous donors willing to donate their time, services and goods, we received:

- Hundreds of hand-sewn drawstring backpacks and pillowcase dresses, school supplies, and hygiene items
- Bibles for every school
- Two Blue Bird school buses flown into Haiti by the U.S. Air Force
- Thousands of pounds of rice, beans, and Kids Against Hunger food packets
- Thousands of hours of effort and love given by our volunteer coordinators who helped with projects and fundraising events



Rebuilding Hope 2020

Rebuilding Hope 2020 has three primary objectives:

- Nurture outstanding leaders by building and strengthening two locally-operated Christian orphanages
- Educate outstanding leaders by building and strengthening ten locally-operated Christian schools
- Train outstanding leaders by establishing Christian camps, after -school clubs, and post-secondary scholarship programs
 The complete cost to implement this 10-year plan is \$5M --\$500,000 annually. Thanks to HFHC's Rebuilding Hope financial partners, \$525,000 was raised in 2013, bringing the total to \$1.5M raised in the first three years of this initiative. Ninety (90) cents of every dollar raised went directly to fund the projects and programs.







HFHC's 10-Year Plan to Nurture, Educate, & Train
