### THE PLAN

In November 2010, the Board of Directors for Hope for Haiti's Children adopted a long-term plan entitled Rebuilding Hope 2020 with the ultimate goal of providing a comprehensive and sustainable infrastructure to continually develop outstanding leaders. Rebuilding Hope 2020 has three primary objectives:

- 1. Nurture children by building and strengthening two Christian orphanages
- 2. Educate outstanding leaders by building and strengthening ten locally-operated Christian schools
- 3. **Train** outstanding leaders by providing after-school **clubs**, vocational training **programs**, and Christian **camps**

The complete cost to implement this 10-year plan is \$5M -- \$500,000 annually. Thanks to HFHC's Rebuilding Hope financial partners, over \$3M has been raised to date.

Congregations and individuals assist with monthly support and directed gifts to Rebuilding Hope efforts. Rebuilding Hope 2020 corporate/organizational partners include the Air Force Denton Program, Live Beyond, and Healing Hands International.

Hope for Haiti's Children Ministries holds Charity Navigator's highest 4-star Rating and the Gold Guidestar Exchange Seal for Charities.

### NURTURE OUTSTANDING LEADERS

### 2010 BEGINNINGS

Hope for Haiti's Children supports 48 Haitian orphans at one orphanage, the Cazeau Christian Orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti.

### 2020 GOAL

Hope for Haiti's Children will support 108 Haitian orphans at two orphanages, 72 at the Cazeau Christian Orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti and 36 at the Thomazeau Christian Orphanage outside the town of Thomazeau, Haiti.

Haiti now has an estimated 170,000 orphans. Hope for Haiti's Children's orphanages not only provide necessary food, clothing, housing, and medical care, but they are leadership training centers, run by loving Haitian caretakers.

### CAZEAU (CÄ-ZŌ) CHRISTIAN ORPHANAGE

Sonya and Jean Toussaint were hired as house parents in 2003 and still lovingly care for the Cazeau orphans today. The children have devotionals and memorize God's Word and pray every night before they sleep. A security guard, cook, and cleaning ladies assist Sonya with the cleaning and cooking. Many of the children that have graduated from this facility have become local Christian leaders and are having a positive influence on the lives of others.

Each orphan is support by an:

- Orphan Care sponsor who contributes \$60/month towards their lodging, Christian caretakers, and medical/dental costs
- Daily Bread Sponsor who contributes \$60/month to cover their food/water expenses
- Child Education Sponsor who contributes \$36/month for their Christian education

### CAZEAU CHRISTIAN ORPHANAGE

### **COMPLETED (2016 projects in blue)**

- Expanded its capacity to 72 (from 48) by adding an additional bunk bed to each dorm room.
- Expanded kitchen and dining hall serving capacity to feed 72 children instead of 48
- •Constructed Phase I of organic raised-bed vegetable gardens, egglaying hens, chickens and turkeys to feed children
- •Replaced entire septic system
- Constructed a concrete playground area
- •Improved dormitory and bedrooms to meet new government standards (additional windows, clothes closets, desks, etc.)
- •Replaced unreliable gas stove in kitchen
- •Improved running water system for dormitory bathrooms and kitchen
- •Add screens to windows (\$500)
- •Add storm shutters to certain windows (\$500)
- Constructed Phase II of organic raised-bed vegetable gardens with egg-laying hens, chickens, and turkeys to feed children (\$500 with Healing Hands assistance)
- •Painted Orphanage Dormitories and Kitchen
- Put in Reverse Osmosis Water System
- Built Food Storage Area

- Add concrete sitting area for children around large tree / soccer field
- •Add playground equipment (swings, slide, monkey bars) to playground area (\$4,000)
- Replace septic and plubing system in dormitores and house-parent quarters (\$8,000)
- •Storm shutters for library and sewing classroom (1,000)
- •Cooking pots and pans/stove burners (\$1,000)
- •Install a water catchement system for garden
- Replace leaking plumbing in houseparents quarters
- Finish concrete paving in back of houseparents quarters
- •Reduce number of beds to 60 (upstairs "teen" rooms have 4 per room)

### THOMAZEAU (TOM-Ä-ZŌ) CHRISTIAN ORPHANAGE

In 2010, development began of 25 acres of HFHC owned property, now known as the HFHC Hope Center, located about 1½ hours northeast of Port-au-Prince near the city of Thomazeau. In January 2012, HFHC opened Phase I of the Thomazeau Christian Orphanage located in the northwest corner of the Hope Center. The facilities include a boys' and girls' dorm, a kitchen, a dining hall, and staff housing. Adjacent to the orphanage dormitories and kitchen, the Mission House provides American-style housing for ongoing short-term U.S. mission teams for up to 22 volunteers.

As of January 2014, the orphanage is home to 12 wonderful children who keep Natacha Pierre, our orphanage administrator and primary care-giver, extremely busy! She understands the needs of these children since Natacha herself was orphaned at age three and grew up in HFHC's Cazeau orphanage. Natacha is an outstanding Christian young lady with a huge heart for children. Besides graduating from Delmas Christian High School, Natacha is fluent in four languages (English, Spanish, French, and Creole) and is a trained professional seamstress.

## PROJECT

### THOMAZEAU CHRISTIAN ORPHANAGE

### COMPLETED (2016 projects in blue)

- •Constructed Phase I dormitory in existing walled area to house up to 16 children under the age of 8
- •Constructed Phase I kitchen in existing Team Center to feed 16 children
- •Constructed Phase I dining area in existing Mission House for 16 children
- Constructed on-site orphanage administrator/worker housing quarters in current walled area
- •Constructed showers/latrines in current walled area for 16 children
- Partnered with Thomazeau mayor to extend electrical service 1 mile from city to orphanage
- Fenced 17 acres for local organic gardens, fruit tree farm, and animal farming (goats, tilapia, etc.)
- •Constructed Phase I of organic raised-bed vegetable gardens, fruit tree farm, egg-laying hens, meat goats, and tilapia tanks to feed children
- Constructed security gate at entrance to acreage
- Constructed a concrete playground area outside of dormitory
- Purchase reliable 4-wheel drive vehicle for orphanage (\$15k)
- Construct playground equipment on sand-filled playground area behind dormitories (\$500 + grant)
- •Added storm shutters to orphanage dorms to prevent water from coming inside
- Purchased newmattresses purchased for orphanage beds
- "Cubbies" built for girls and boys dorm
- Enhanced power system to make cost-effective use of inverter / batteries charged from city power with backup generator
- •Construct Kitchen/Dining Hall with storage areas and bakery area
- Purchase reliable 4-wheel drive vehicle for orphanage

- New solar-powered electrical system with donated solar panels from Solar World and free installation from U.S. professionals (\$25,000)
- •Add storm shutters to staff housing to prevent water from coming inside (\$2K)
- •Construct 3 security walls for the Phase II orphanage compound (\$25,000)
- Plant additional fruit / shade trees
- Construct Phase II orphanage dormitories and bathrooms (housing 20 boys and 20 girls, each with a additional caretaker room and an administrator apartment)
- Construct tilapia / aquaponic system


### **EDUCATE OUTSTANDING LEADERS**

### 2010 BEGINNINGS

Hope for Haiti's Children has established and funded 9 Christian school facilities in partnership with local Haitian churches of Christ.

### 2020 GOAL

Hope for Haiti's Children will now support 10 Christian schools, having constructed the Thomazeau Christian Primary School through RH2020 efforts. Continual improvements to each of these schools will vary but may include: computer training facilities, additional classrooms, school lunch programs, playground areas, security gates, and roofing. In addition, regular teacher training programs and teacher evaluation programs will be added.

### CAZEAU (CÄ-ZŌ) CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

This outstanding school educates 162 children. For the past 7 years, students achieved an impressive pass rate of 100% on their  $6^{th}$  grade national exams! To continue this quality education and to comply with new government mandates, grades  $1^{st}$ - $4^{th}$  are needed to be constructed on the  $2^{nd}$  floor.



### CAZEAU CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### COMPLETED (2016 projects in blue)

- •Repair security wall
- •Construct separate kindergarten classrooms to the west of existing school/church facility
- Purchase cooking supplies, bowls and utensils for school lunch program
- Constructed additional school desks/benches/tables for classrooms
- •Built concrete K1-K3 building
- Add kitchen area to the west of the existing school facility for school lunch program (\$8K)
- Restart school lunch program as donated food supply allows

### BY 2020 (2017 proposed in red)

- •Construct concrete 1st-4th grades classrooms on top floor (\$20,000)
- •Plaster and paint Kindergarten classrooms and kitchen.

# P R O J E C T S

### DELMAS (DEL-MÄ) CHRISTIAN PRIMARY/SECONDARY SCHOOL

Prior to its complete destruction in the earthquake, this well-respected 3-story elementary and high school in downtown Port-au-Prince educated 500 students each school year. The school building also served as a place of worship for the church and provided classroom space for a local nursing school. The first floor rebuild was completed in January 2012. The second floor, housing a majority of the school classrooms, was finished in 2013. A large eastern and southern retaining walls with proper drainage are being completed in 2015. The third floor was enclosed in 2016 to include additional classrooms for the higher secondary grades, a computer lab, nursing school, and preacher training school.

### DELMAS CHRISTIAN PRIMARY/SECONDARY SCHOOL

### **COMPLETED (2016 projects in blue)**

- •Remove rubble
- Purchase two adjacent properties to current property
- Complete first floor auditorium with bathrooms and seating for nursing school / pre-school / Kindergarten
- •Complete second floor classroom area with school benches, offices and bathrooms
- Construct a concrete playground area on roof
- Purchased a school bus for transportation for Cazeau, Cite Soleil and Mission Cross secondary students
- Constructed third floor classrooms
- Constructed third floor school lunch cooking area
- Constructed additional school desks/benches/tables for classrooms
- Purchased a school bus for transportation for Cazeau, Cite Soleil and Mission Cross secondary students
- Constructed third floor classrooms

### PROJECT

### THOMAZEAU (TOM-Ä-ZŌ) CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

HFHC owns 25 acres an  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hour drive northeast of Port-au-Prince near the city of Thomazeau. Adjacent to the HFHC orphanage and Mission House, a new Thomazeau Christian Elementary School serves 231 children from the Debas ( $D\bar{a}-b\ddot{a}$ ) and northern mountain regions of Thomazeau. Plans call to continue to build the primary school, one classroom or more each year as funds permit. A new latrine is necessary to handle the expanded number of children in school.

### THOMAZEAU CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### COMPLETED (2016 projects in blue)

- Construct Preschool (K-1 & K-2) classroom with covered porch
- Construct Kindergarten (K-3) classroom with covered porch
- Construct concrete latrines
- Construct school office with covered porch
- Purchase cooking supplies, bowls and utensils for school lunch program
- •-Constructed 1st Grade classroom with covered porch
- •Construct 2nd Grade classroom with covered porch
- Add metal office shutters
- •Construct 3rd Grade classroom with covered porch
- •-Constructed additional school desks/benches/tables for classrooms
- Constructed pavilion with metal roof for assemblies
- Constructed metal security gate in front of school grounds
- Constructed kitchen with sink/gas stove for school lunch program
- Built a school/community water tower with concrete spikots at street using an electic deep well pump
- •Restart a school lunch program as donated food supply allows
- •Complete plastering inside of the pavilion (\$5K)
- •Smooth floor of pavilion (\$3K)
- Complete plastering in front of pavilion and paint with signage (4K\$)
- Construct 4th Grade classroom (\$16K)
- •Construct new latrine and demolish/fill-in existing one

- •Construct west storage closet with shelving (\$2,500)
- Construct 5th Grade classroom
- Construct 6th Grade classroom
- Storage Filing Cabinets each room needs a locakable filing cabinet (\$300 per classroom - 8 rooms)
- Construct a school health clinic/pharmacy office area
- Plant shade trees in northern courtyard and put in concrete bench seating areas



### **BRAJIROIS CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL**

### 2016 Projects Funded:

Adjacent land purchase funded (\$1,400)

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- Build separate building with rooms to house K1-4<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms (\$15,000)
- Build a bathroom latrine (\$1,500)
- Build a kitchen and storage room to start a school lunch program



### CITE SOLEIL CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### 2016 Projects Funded:

- Lunch program provided 5 days/week
- Homes for sponsored children built

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- Kitchen tables to serve school lunches (\$500)
- Computer and Printer (\$1,000)
- Secure entire 3-acre property with concrete fence
- Concrete fencing of an ½ acre west of school for a soccer field with goals with a west school entrance (\$8K)



### **DUBUISSON CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL**

### 2016 Projects Funded:

- Manually dig a well and install a robust hand pump with concrete base to provide clean water (\$4K)
- Plastering and Painting of inside of school (\$2K)

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- School is near road and needs a 4-foot security wall with a gate to prevent young children from being hit by cars/motorcycles (\$7K)
- Build a kitchen and food storage room for a school lunch program (\$8,000)



### MIREBALAIS CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### 2016 Projects Funded:

- Replace roof which is in very poor condition (\$8K)
- Paint school inside and out

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- Build principal's office and a storage room for future school lunch program (\$5,000)
- Well Pump house (\$1,000)
- Dig a new latrine (\$2,000)



### PAGESTE CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### 2016 Projects Funded:

 Build a concrete-block addition to house the preschool and kindergarten with a room for a principal's office on the north side of the school (\$10K)

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- Batteries to run solar system —Solar panels allow the school to have light during the night. This enables children and church members to gather for devotionals and community gatherings. The current batteries need replacing. (\$1,400)
- Build a kitchen and storage room to start a school lunch program



### ROBERT CHRISTIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### 2016 Projects Funded:

Dug a new latrine

### 2020 Projects (2017 proposed in red)

- 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade Classrooms Finish concrete plastering and painting and install 3 security doors (\$5,000)
- School sits next to a cemetery. A dividing wall is needed (\$3,000)
- Build a kitchen and storage room to start a school lunch program



### TRAIN OUTSTANDING LEADERS

### 2020 GOAL

Hope for Haiti's Children believes that children can be encouraged to become leaders as they participate in extra-curricular activities, including after-School Clubs. Plans call for clubs to be formed over time in English, Computers, Gardening, Sewing and Farm Animal Care.

Younger children would be encouraged to come to vacation day schools held at the school facility, such as a 3-4 day Vacation Bible School.

Post-secondary education is important for certain highly-skilled occupations, and so by 2020, HFHC also plans to have 25 young people sponsored in the PACES (Promising Adult Continuing Education Sponsorship) program.

HFHC's Christian Leadership Camp combines devotionals, discussion groups, and recreational activities for about 180 sponsored Haitian teens to encourage and equip them to become mature Christian leaders in their communities. The current high cost of renting an appropriate facility limits the number of participants and the duration of the camp. By 2020, HFHC plans to construct a permanent Christian Youth Camp facility at the Hope Center in Thomazeau.


### HOPE FOR HAITI'S CHILDREN CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP YOUTH CAMP

HFHC's Christian Leadership Youth Camp is currently held at a rented facility during the last week of July each summer for 180 of our sponsored teens. The camp makes a huge impact on our young people, as they participate in classes and activities that focus on leadership development, family and marriage, and Christian values/ethics. These classes are interspersed with fun group activities and talent shows which build strong relationships among our young people.

Rebuilding Hope 2020 plans include holding regular building permanent camp facilities at the HFHC Hope Center in Thomazeau. This will allow younger teens to participate in summer camp and allow these camps to run throughout the entire summer.

### P.A.C.E.S. PROGRAM

HFHC's Promising Adult Continuing Education Sponsorship (PACES) program provides young adults with scholarships to receive additional post-secondary training in the Port-au-Prince area.



### AFTER-SCHOOL CLUBS AND VACATION DAY CAMP PROGRAMS

After-school clubs and vacation day camp programs allow children to develop specialized training in areas such as Bible, computers, English, gardening and farm animal care.
